Lilliput Program Plans April Dramatic Workshops

Lilliput Children's Programs has announced the scheduling of a week of Creative Dramatics Workshops to be held from April 27 to May 1.

Mrs. Muriel Sharon Tillim will conduct the in-service workshops in those school districts participating in the In-School Program.

Mrs. Tillim received a B.S. from Western Reserve University and studied at Bristol University, England on a Fulbright Fellowship.

She received theater training at the Neighborhood Playhouse

School of the Theater, American School of the Ballet, and mime with Etienne Decroux.

She has been producer - director of The Pocket Players, an adult professional touring company performing for children, and is a member of The Actor's Studio Director's Unit.

Mrs. Tillim is currently artistic director of the Junior School of the Neighborhood Playhouse School of the Theater, Director of the Children's Drama Department of the 92nd St. YM-YWHA in New York City, and Consultant for Project Create, a

Title III Program in Connecticut.

She is also a certified assistant director in the Moreno Institute of Psychodrama, and is in training for a full directorship of Psychodrama and its application to role playing in education.

Role playing, a tool of psychodrama, is a technique which may be very effectively used by the classroom teacher. It is most useful in helping children to identify with, and therefore more fully understand, persons in literature, history and real life. The children are encouraged to devise their own action and

words for a character, and in so doing, gain an emotional as well as an intellectual understanding which aids in providing a meaningful and lasting learning experience.



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
